

Introduction

Welcome to the Spring 2023 edition of the VRBC Growth Guide! The idea behind this resource is that consistently spending time with God in Scripture and prayer is one of the keys to strengthening your relationship with him.

Where Does Growth Come From?

A couple of months ago, a friend of mine dropped by the house with a bag of big, beautiful lemons. This friend has a lemon tree in his yard and had recently harvested over a hundred lemons (!), and we had the blessing of enjoying the fruits of his labor in the form of sweet homemade lemonade and tart lemon squares.

I've never been much of a gardener myself, but I am absolutely fascinated by the miracle of growth. To think that my friend could have a lemon tree in his yard and that over time *actual lemons* would appear on the branches is amazing to me.

The growth of the lemons is a miracle – nothing my friend does can force it to happen. But that doesn't mean that he doesn't have a role to play. Far from it! He waters the tree regularly, fertilizes with special citrus fertilizer, and even has a portable "house" (complete with a heater!) that he puts around the tree when it's cold outside. By doing these things, he isn't creating lemons. Instead, he's creating the conditions where lemons can grow.

Spiritual growth works the same way. It is a miracle of grace what anyone becomes more loving, or peace-filled, or patient. There is nothing that we can do to make that happen. But like my friend with his lemon tree, we can create the conditions where that kind of growth can happen naturally.

There are lots of important ways to create these types of conditions, including investing in spiritual friendship, worship, serving, and more. But over the centuries, followers of Jesus have consistently found that regularly reading and reflecting on God's word and talking with him about it through prayer is at the very center of any spiritual growth plan.

That's the reason we've put this guidebook together: we want to encourage and resource you to deepen your relationship with Jesus by spending time with him in Scripture and prayer. And as you "remain in Jesus as he remains in you" (John 15:5), we look forward to celebrating the fruit that results through the power of the Holy Spirit!



How to Use This Guide

Each daily entry in this guide contains an opening Call to Worship, a Scripture passage to read and meditate on, a couple of questions to think about, and an opportunity to talk with God (pray) about what you've read and heard. Here are a few thoughts to keep in mind:

- We've designed these devotions to be flexible. If a daily devotion is a new experience
 for you, you might want to start by setting aside ten minutes a day to go through the
 material and pray. Don't worry too much about the length of time it's better to spend
 a few minutes each day than to spend an hour every once in a while. And as time goes
 by and you get more comfortable, you may even find yourself naturally wanting to
 spend a little longer on each devotion.
- If you miss a day, don't stress over it! Just pick up where you left off the next day. We've only given you five devotions per week, so you have a couple of extra "catch-up" days built into each week. And remember, this is meant to be a blessing, not a burden!
- Many people find that picking a specific time and place to have their devotion each
 day helps them stay consistent. Remember there's no "perfect" way to do this. Just
 find the time and place that works best for you where you can spend a few quiet,
 uninterrupted moments by yourself.
- Each day, you might want to follow a basic order like this:
 - o Take a moment to sit quietly, recognizing that God is with you and loves you completely.
 - o Begin by saying a short prayer. Share anything you need or want to say to God, welcome his Spirit into this moment, and ask him to speak to you through his Word.
 - Go through the Scripture reading for the day. Make sure to take your time and read slowly. You might want to read the passage several times. As you read, ask yourself: What do I notice about the passage? How might God be speaking to me today through these words?
 - o Spend a few moments reflecting on and answering the questions listed. Many people find it helpful to jot down a few of their thoughts about the questions in the space provided. Taking a few notes has a way of helping us clarify what we're thinking, and it will also help you remember your experience better so you can share it with others.



o Close by spending a few moments in prayer, submitting yourself to God and asking him to make you more like Jesus. If you like, you can write out some or all of your prayer in the space provided.

A Few Defails

The Scripture readings included in this guide have been intentionally selected to complement the topics we'll be covering in the Sunday sermons and our Grow Group sessions. Most weeks, the Friday reading comes from the passage we're currently planning to use for that weekend's sermon (of course, the sermon texts are all tentative and could change between now and then). The majority of the other readings come from books of the Bible that have some connection with what we're studying.

During the first four weeks, we'll be going through a sermon series covering the "One Anothers" of Scripture. In the Suday sermons and the daily readings, we'll be focusing on how followers of Jesus are to treat one another.

Over the next seven weeks, during the season of Lent, we'll be reading through a significant portion of the gospel of John. Lent is a time where Christians traditionally focus on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. These readings will help us do that as well as supporting the "This Is My Story" sermon series, also from the gospel of John, that we'll be going through during that timeframe.

Our next sermon series will come from Revelation 2-3, and our daily readings will come from the first part of the book of Revelation, as well as some corollary passages that support the themes of the sermons. We'll finish the spring with selected readings from the Psalms and the first two chapters of Acts.

As you look through the readings, you'll notice that some days we give you a passage of 10 or 15 verses to read, but then we specify a few verses to focus on. On these days, we're including the longer reading to give you context, but encouraging you to focus specifically on the few verses that the questions will be based on. We suggest that you read the entire passage once and then read the verses to focus on several times. Note that the longer reading may be the same for several days in a row, while the verses to focus on will change each day. This gives you several days to soak in a longer passage, concentrating on a bit at a time each day.



A Final Word

I'd love to invite you to keep one thing in mind as you go through this book. You aren't doing this to earn brownie points with God or to impress your friends! God already loves you fully and completely. Spending time with him in Scripture and prayer doesn't make him love you any more, and missing a day won't make him love you any less. That isn't the point!

The point is that because God loves you, he wants to spend time with you. And because a dynamic, transformative relationship with Jesus is the best possible thing for us, investing in that relationship is an opportunity, not an obligation.

So please, don't view this resource as a guilt trip, a duty, or a way to "be a good person." View it instead as an invitation to experience the beauty, joy, and transforming power of spending time with our loving and gracious King.

May God bless you as you "abide in the vine"!
